FIRST MO STATE FQHR AFFILIATE YEAR-END AWARD GUIDELINES

Any changes and/or revisions in any award given, or any eligibility requirements, or methods of tabulation in any division which are to be presented in any given year, must be approved by the FMSFQHRA Board of Directors prior to the beginning of the year for which the awards are to be given.

To be eligible for year-end awards all exhibitors and owners must be current members of FMSFQHRA. The horse being exhibited will not be eligible for year-end points until receipt of payment of FMSFQHRA membership fees have been paid. Points will start being tabulated at time of payment. Points will not be received prior to membership of FMSFQHRA.

In the event a stallion is gelded during the show year, it will receive points as a stallion, and then will start over as a gelding. Points will not be added together.

When change of ownership of a horse occurs, the owner must have an appropriate membership to continue accumulating points.

Versatility Open and Amateur exhibitors must compete in five categories as selected by the exhibitor. Please refer to FQHR rulebook for the required classes. Youth versatility must compete in four categories as listed in FQHR rulebook.

In the event of a tie, the horse placing over the greater number of horses will be declared the winner.

The 4-H/FFA year-end class awards will be supported by a separate entity.

Year-end awards will list the owner of the horse on the award unless specified differently by the owner, with the exception of the youth awards.

It is mandatory to compete in three of the four shows to qualify for the year-end awards.

High Point All-Around exhibitors **MUST** compete in any three or more separate classes throughout the year in their perspective division, in three out of four shows, to be eligible for year-end awards.

Awards are to be offered to the first place Class High Point winner and second place runner-up. Third place through Sixth place Class High Point winner will receive a Certificate of Achievement.
